Strike out all after the enacting clause, and insert:

"That Mary Anne Farrell, be, and she is hereby divorced from bed, board, and mutual co-habitation with her husband James U. Farrell."

Section 2. And be it enacted, That the said James U. Farrell shall not be liable for any debt to be hereafter contracted by the said Mary Anne Farrell, nor be entitled to any property which she may hereafter acquire.

Section 3. And be it enacted, That the name of said Mary Anne Farrell, be, and the same is hereby changed to her maiden name, of Mary Anne Ennis.

Section 4. And be it enacted, That the said Mary Anne Farrell, be, from the passage of this act entitled, to all the rights and privileges of a *feme sole*, ex-
