John Henry, Esq; from the senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker a petition from John Mitchell, setting forth, that he had a schooner impressed into the public service by David Poe, D. Q. M. at Baltimore, to transport troops from the head of Elk to Petersburg in Virginia, that on her return she was captured by a privateer and burnt, and praying relief in the premises; and a petition from Abraham Enfor, of Baltimore county, setting forth, that in the year seventeen hundred and seventy, agreeable to the instructions given by the proprietary to his agents and commissioners, he had surveyed and laid out for him twelve hundred acres of land, being part of his lordship's reserved land, lying in the counties of Baltimore and Harford, in three several different surveys, by James Calder, Esq; surveyor for Baltimore county; that he agreed for and compounded with the aforesaid commissioners for the sum of ten pounds sterling money by the hundred acres, which he did not pay, in consequence of his lordship's sudden death; that since the act passed in November session, 1781, several other persons, having an earlier knowledge thereof than himself, obtained a warrant therefor, notwithstanding they were fully acquainted with the premises; that he tendered the money upon the old surveys agreeable to act of assembly; that he is ready to compound on the old surveys, or under a new warrant, and praying relief in the premises; severally endorsed; "By the senate, June 3, 1782: Read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.
