

RESOLVED, That no execution or executions shall issue against Archibald Job, of Cæcil county, on two several judgments obtained against him, at the suit of the state of Maryland, in the eastern shore general court, at September term, 1790, until after April term, 1791; and if any execution or executions have already issued, they shall be and are hereby suspended until after April term, 1791, the said Archibald Job first paying all costs that have been incurred on the part of the state in the prosecution of the said suits.

The bill for the benefit of Essex Sherburne Ridley, was read the second time, and the question put, That the said bill do pass? The yeas and nays being called for by Mr. Ringgold, appeared as follow:

So it was resolved in the affirmative.
Sent to the senate, with the resolution in favour of Archibald Job, by Mr. Bayly.

On the second reading the bill for the better administration of justice, agreeably to the order of the day, the question was put, That the house reconsider the following clause in the said bill? "And be it enacted, that the governor and the council be authorized and requested to appoint and commission, for each of the said districts, one person of integrity and experience, and sound legal knowledge, who shall reside in the district for which he is appointed, (who shall be styled in the commission, chief justice of the county courts in such district;) and to appoint and commission, in each of the counties of this state, two persons of integrity, experience and knowledge, residents of the county for which they were appointed, (who shall be styled in the commission, associate justices of the county court of the county for which they shall be appointed;) and the said justices shall hold their commission during good behaviour, and may be removed for misbehaviour, in the same manner as the chancellor and the judges may be removed agreeably to the constitution of this state, and not otherwise."
