On motion, the question was put, That the house reconsider the said first enacting clause? Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, That the said bill do pass? Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Winchester, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act to enable Legh Master, of Frederick county, to devise certain estates therein mentioned; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill to alter such parts of the constitution and form of government which prevent persons from being members of the legislature, electors of the senate, or to hold offices of profit and trust, other than those who shall take an oath, was read the second time by especial order, and the question put, That the said bill do pass?
