The bill being read throughout, the question was put, That the said bill do pass? Resolved in the affirmative.

The house adjourns till to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

T H U R S D A Y, December 25, 1794.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. R. Bond and Mr. Wootton. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, the supplement to the act, entitled, An act to freighten and amend the several public roads in several counties, and for other purposes therein mentioned, the bill for the relief of Cornelius West, of Talbot county, the bill for the payment of the journal of accounts, the bill respecting the indenting of deeds, and the bill to repeal the fortieth section of the constitution and form of government, were sent to the senate by the clerk.

The amendments to the additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Easton, in Talbot county, and to establish and regulate a market at the said town, were read the second time, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

On motion, the question was put, That the bill for building a new gaol in the town of Easton, in Talbot county, and to provide for the regulation of the said gaol, be postponed until Wednesday fortnight? The yeas and nays being required by three members, appeared as follow:

The engrossed bills No. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 45, 48, 50 and 51, were read and assented to, and sent to the senate, with the paper bills thereof, by the clerk.

The bill for building a new gaol in the town of Easton, in Talbot county, and to provide for the regulation of the said gaol, was read the second time, and passed. Sent to the senate by the clerk.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to settle and pay the civil list, and other expences of civil government, endorsed; "By the senate, December 25, 1794: Upon reconsideration will pass. By order, N. PINKNEY, clk."

Ordered to be engrossed.

The bill for the relief of the poor of Harford county, was read the second time, and passed. Sent to the senate by the clerk.

Mr. Key, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the letter of Henry Lee, commander in chief of the late expedition to suppress the insurrection in the western counties of Pennsylvania, having taken the same into consideration, report, that the object of said letter, in soliciting additional pay to the non-commissioned officers, musicians and privates, who were engaged in said expedition, is praise-worthy and patriotic, and are of opinion that an act should immediately pass for that purpose. All which is submitted, &c.

Which was read the first and second time, concurred with, and leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto. ORDERED, That the committee appointed on the said letter prepare and bring in the same.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay unto John Lee, of Washington county, the sum of four pounds ten shillings, for one day's attendance as a witness for the state, at October term, seventeen hundred and ninety-four, and itinerant charges, which was not returned to the committee of claims, and is not allowed in the journal of accounts.

Sent to the senate by the clerk.

The further supplement to an act, entitled, An act for enlarging the power of the high court of chancery, was read the second time, and passed with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. At the end of the preamble insert "therefore," and in the first enacting clause strike out the word "therefore."

The bill to alter such parts of the constitution and form of government as gives the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, the appointment of officers of the militia, was read the second time, and passed. Sent to the senate by the clerk.

On motion, ORDERED, That the printer of the state be directed to print at the end of the votes and proceedings a list of all the bills which have been either referred or rejected during the session, and also at the end of the acts of assembly a list of the public laws, separate from the private laws.
