On motion, the question was put, That the further consideration of the bill to declare the effect of judgments upon lands and tenements, and to direct the sheriffs in the service of executions, and for other purposes, be referred to the next session of assembly? THE committee to whom was referred the memorial of Allen Quynn, Esquire, of the city of Annapolis, report, that from a certificate given by the treasurer of the western shore, they find, the said memorialist, as one of the securities of William Goldsmith, deceased, late sheriff and collector for Anne-Arundel county, has paid into the treasury the sum of two hundred and four pounds six shillings and four pence current money, being the amount of a judgment obtained against him, as a security of said Goldsmith, with an interest of six per cent. on the balance due, and costs; they are therefore of opinion it would be reasonable to release the memorialist from the payment of the nine per cent. interest, and recommend the following resolution:

RESOLVED, That Allen Quynn, one of the securities of William Goldsmith, deceased, late sheriff and collector for Anne-Arundel county, be released from the payment of nine per cent. interest on the balance which was due to the state from the said Goldsmith, he having paid the said balance, with interest of six per cent. thereon, since the death of the said Goldsmith.
