M O N D A Y, November 14, 1803.

THE house met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read. Mr. Pearce has leave of absence for a few days. Mr. Philip Stuart, a delegate returned for Charles county, Mr. Luke W. Barber, a delegate returned for Saint-Mary's county, Mr. Henry J. Carroll, a delegate returned for Somerset county, Mr. Daniel Sheredine, a delegate returned for Cæcil county, Mr. John Thomas, a delegate returned for Kent county, Mr. Henry Kemp, a delegate returned for Frederick county, Mr. Edward Lloyd and Mr. Thomas S. Denny, delegates returned for Talbot county, appeared, and after qualifying in the mode prescribed by the constitution and form of government, and taking the oath to support the constitution of the United States, took their seats in the house. Mr. Ridgely appeared in the house.

The bill to settle and ascertain the salary of the members of the council for the ensuing year, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill for the relief of Thomas Parvin, an insolvent debtor of Frederick county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

Mr. Lemmon, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for finishing a house of public worship in Baltimore county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A petition from Robert Polk, of Dorchester county, praying indulgence may be given him for a sum of money which he is indebted to the state, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Goldsborough, Mr. Frazier and Mr. Clarke, to consider and report thereon.

The following message being prepared, was read, agreed to, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, NOVEMBER 14, 1803.

GENTLEMEN OF THE SENATE,

WITH the concurrence of your house, we propose to proceed to the election of a governor at twelve o'clock this day, agreeably to the constitution and form of government. The honourable Robert Bowie is put in nomination by us; and we have appointed Mr. Montgomery and Mr. Wilson to join such gentlemen as may be appointed by you to examine the ballots, and to report thereon.

Petitions from Thomas Bailey, Jonas Yoner, Abraham Kauffman, Elihu Underwood, Nicholas Walter and George Balist, of the city of Baltimore, and William Crawford, of Caroline county, praying acts of insolvency, were preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

A petition from William Cropper, and others, of Worcester county, stating that they labour under great inconvenience for the want of the use of a landing called Winding's Landing, and praying that commissioners may be appointed to lay off and make public the road that leads from William Cropper's through the lands of John Bliggard, Littleton Robins, and others, to the landing aforesaid, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Wilson, Mr. Purnell and Mr. Sturgis, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from Kettmah Milbourn, of Worcester county, widow of Thomas Milbourn, stating that there are considerable debts due from the estate of her late husband, and praying that a law may pass authorising the sale of part of the real estate in aid of the personal estate, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on the petition of William Cropper, and others.

Mr. Miller, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of finishing a house of worship at Ephesus, in Cæcil county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Clarke, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the following report:
