

The house proceeded to the second reading of the bill to incorporate the stockholders of the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Baltimore, and, on motion by Mr. Comegys, the question was put, That the words "Farmers and" be stricken out of the title? Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Archer, the question was put, That the words "for its use and benefit," be stricken out of the first clause after the words "by the state of Maryland?" Determined in the negative.

The bill being read throughout, the question was put, Shall the said bill pass? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:

Mr. Archer delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of William Smith, devisee of Robert Smith, late of Harford county; Mr. Frazier delivers a bill, entitled, An act to alter and abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government as make the clerks of the court of appeals, the clerks of the county courts, and the registers of wills, removable only for misbehaviour on conviction in a court of law; and Mr. Handy delivers a bill, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of lumber; which were read.

Mr. Boyle delivers a bill, entitled, An act to prevent the increase of banking companies; which was read.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, ORDERED, That the supplement to the bill relating to negroes, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, have a second reading on to-morrow.

The house adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. William Williams. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill to incorporate the stockholders of the Commercial and Farmers Bank of Baltimore, the bill to incorporate the stockholders of the Marine Bank of Baltimore, and the bill to incorporate the stockholders of the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Baltimore, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Comegys delivers a petition from John Moore, of Kent county, praying to be remunerated for damages sustained by fire while discharging his official duty; which was read and referred to Mr. Comegys, Mr. Archer, Mr. Stevens, Mr. Groome, Mr. Bowles, Mr. Handy and Mr. Warfield.

Mr. Harryman delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county, praying a law may pass for widening and straightening the by-road from near Thomas Sutton's; which was read and referred to Mr. Harryman, Mr. M. Brown and Mr. Randall.

Mr. Harryman delivers a petition from Edward Norwood, of Baltimore county, praying that an act to lay out a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to the city of Washington may not be revived; which was read and referred to the committee appointed to bring in a bill for that purpose.

Mr. Randall delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county and city, praying for a lottery to raise a sum of money to pave the road from the north end of Howard-street to the Falls turnpike road; which was read and referred to Mr. Randall, Mr. M. Brown and Mr. Harryman.

Mr. Harryman delivers a memorial from the president and managers of the Falls turnpike company, praying for a repeal of the 20th section of the act for the incorporation of the said company; which was read and referred to Mr. Harryman, Mr. Bland, Mr. Martin, Mr. M. Brown and Mr. Randall.

On motion by Mr. A. Browne, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to repeal part of an act of assembly therein mentioned. ORDERED, That Mr. A. Browne, Mr. Perry and Mr. Hilleary, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Archer delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of John S. Moffitt; which was read.

Mr. Randall delivers a bill, entitled, An act to authorise a lottery or lotteries in the city of Baltimore for the purpose therein mentioned; which was read.

The bill to appoint Thomas Woodfield, of Anne-Arundel county, trustee for the sale of the real estate of Joshua Hall, late of said county, deceased, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Wharton delivers a petition from Elizabeth Belmeare, of Montgomery county, praying for a sale of part of the land purchased of Samuel Belmeare; which was read and referred to Mr. Wharton, Mr. Perry and Mr. Abram Jones.

On motion by Mr. Bland, ORDERED, That the resolution relative to the United States bank have a second reading on the 13th instant.
