On motion by Mr. Comegys, ORDERED, That capt. John Moore be heard at the bar of this house in person, or by council, on Friday the 14th inst.

Mr. Forwood delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Harford county, praying for a review of the road between William Clark's farm and Lee's quarter; which was read and referred to Mr. Forwood, Mr. Street and Mr. Davis.

Mr. Jump delivers a petition from the trustees of Hillsborough school, in Caroline county, praying that a fine or penalty may be inflicted on any person who shall delude or entice any of the scholars from said school; which was read and referred to Mr. Jump, Mr. Willis and Mr. P. Bayard.

On motion by Mr. T. Hall, the following order was read and assented to.

Whereas it is alleged to this general assembly, that Zebulon Hollingsworth, Esq. has been prevented by indisposition from attending at the bar of this house on the day appointed for the second reading of the report concerning said Zebulon Hollingsworth, Esq. therefore, ORDERED, That the report of the committee of grievances, respecting Zebulon Hollingsworth, Esq. be made the order of the day on the 20th inst.

Mr. Handy delivers a bill, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Worcester county to levy a sum of money for the support of William Peacock, of Worcester county; which was read.

The house resumed the consideration of the report relative to the removal of judge Jones, and after some time spent in hearing counsel at the bar, the question was put, That the house concur with the said report? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow.

W E D N E S D A Y, December 12, 1810.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion by Mr. Bowles, ORDERED, That the witnesses attending on the part of the state against Thomas Jones, be discharged from further attendance, and that the witnesses attending on the part of the state against Zebulon Hollingsworth, Esq. are directed to attend at the bar of this house on the 20th inst.

Mr. Bland delivers a petition from the mayor and city council of Baltimore, praying that they may be authorised to erect a city watch-house on the court-house lot; which was read and referred to Mr. Bland, Mr. Harryman and Mr. Randall.

Mr. Harryman delivers a petition from the proprietors of the cotton factory on Gwynn's Falls, in Baltimore county, praying that the road from said factory to the new cut Liberty road, may be made a public road; which was read and referred to Mr. Harryman, Mr. M. Brown and Mr. Randall.

Mr. Bland delivers a report from Dr. James Smith on the effects which have resulted from one year's operation of the vaccine institution; which was read.

Mr. Emory delivers a petition from Francis C. Hall, of Queen-Anne's county, praying he may be authorised to remove slaves from Delaware to Maryland; which was read and referred to Mr. Emory, Mr. Miers and Mr. Burgess.

Mr. Warfield delivers a petition from John Worthington, of Anne-Arundel county, counter to the petition for a road through his land; which was read and referred to the committee appointed on the petition to which it is counter.

Mr. Emory delivers a petition from Richard Cooke, praying he may be authorised to take the surname of Tilghman; which was read and referred to Mr. Emory, Mr. P. Blake and Mr. Miers.

Mr. Warfield delivers the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the petition of Young Wilkinson, of Anne-Arundel county, an old revolutionary soldier, beg leave to report, that they have had the same under consideration and think the prayer of the petitioner just and reasonable and ought to be granted; therefore,

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay half yearly to Young Wilkinson, of Anne-Arundel county, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a lieutenant for and during the term of his natural life.
