

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Jonas Green the sum of six dollars, to Jeremiah Hughes thirty nine dollars and sixty cents, and to William M'Neir six dollars, for additional printing done since the closing of the journal of accounts.

It was then assented to, and sent to the senate for concurrence.

Mr. Done, in behalf of the committee on ways and means, asked the house to discharge said committee from the further consideration of the several subjects before it, not already reported on.

And on the question. Will the house discharge the said committee according to its request?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. M'Mahon of Allegany, asked and obtained leave to withdraw from the archives of this house, the memorial of Meshach Browning of Allegany county, in relation to a certain decree of the chancellor, as judge of the land office, presented by him on the 27th day of January last, with the accompanying papers; and on his motion, the select committee, to which the said memorial had been referred, was discharged from the further consideration thereof.

Mr. M'Pherson also asked and obtained leave to withdraw from the archives of this house, the memorial of James Cunningham of Frederick county, counter to the memorial of Meshach Browning, just above mentioned, presented by him on the 27th day of January last, and referred to the same committee whose discharge has been noted.

Mr. Hynson asked and obtained leave to withdraw from the files of the house the petition of Edward Browne, former sheriff and collector of Kent county, praying the passage of an act for the further extension of the time heretofore allowed him to complete his collections, and so forth, presented by him on the 31st day of December last.

Mr. M'Mahon of Baltimore city, asked and obtained leave to withdraw from the files of the house, the communication of the honourable William M'Mechen, an associate judge of Baltimore city court, to the legislature of Maryland, praying for redress of certain grievances, therein complained of, laid before this house by the Speaker, on the 23d day of January last, and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice; and also the memorial of William Patterson, and others, citizens of Baltimore, praying for an alteration in the existing judicial system of Baltimore city and county, so far as relates to Baltimore county court, presented to this house by Mr. Steuart of Baltimore city, on the 7th ultimo, and referred to the same committee.
