

The clerk of the Senate returned the bills of this House of the following titles:

An act to regulate the manner of granting out county pensions for Anne Arundel county; endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment." Which amendment was read the first, and by a special order, the second time, and assented to.

Ordered, That the said bill, with the amendment, be engrossed.

And an act to prevent the unnecessary accumulation of costs upon state fines; endorsed, "will not pass."

TUESDAY, February 9th 1830.

The House met at ten o'clock, pursuant to adjournment and the roll being called over; the same members were present as on yesterday.

On motion by Mr. Swan, the rule of the House requiring the Journal of proceedings of the preceding day to be read was suspended; and the reading of said journal was dispensed with.

Mr. Boyer presented a petition of sundry citizens of the village of Berlin and its vicinity, inhabitants of Worcester county, praying for the passage of a law incorporating certain persons therein named, as Trustees for the purpose of receiving a deed of conveyance for an acre of ground on which it is contemplated to build an academy in said village; which was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs Boyer, Hitch and Hutcheson.

The Speaker laid before the House a letter from the Treasurer for the Western Shore, addressed to the 'House of Delegates of Maryland,' enclosing transcripts of the last returns of their condition, received at the Treasury from the several banks, in obedience to the order of the House of the 18th ultimo; which letter was read, and with its accompanying documents, ordered to be printed.

Mr. Edelen presented the petition of Thomas J. Wall of Prince George's county, praying for support by a county assessment.

Mr. John's presented a petition of sundry citizens of Hartford county, praying for such pecuniary relief of Ma-
