

the Treasurer for the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised to invest any further sum or sums which may be received from the Government of the United States, for interest upon the money advanced by the State of Maryland for their use during the late war, either in the State's reserved shares of stock of the Farmers Bank of Maryland, or in those of the Commercial and Farmers Bank of Baltimore, or in the five per cent stocks of the State, or in any or all of them.

This resolution was read the first, and by special order, the second time assented to, and sent to the Senate for concurrence.

Mr. Brown from the select committee, to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled an act, to authorise the levy court of Kent county, to have repaired a certain road therein mentioned.

Mr. Keene from the select committee, to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled an act relating to the records in the Register of Will's Office in Caroline county. And,

Mr. Dorsey, from the select committee appointed on leave granted for the purpose, reported a bill, entitled an act, to repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government, as relate to the division of Frederick county, into eleven election districts, and for other purposes. And,

Mr. Boyer, from the select committee to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled an act, to repeal certain acts relating to Worcester county; and for other purposes.

The four last mentioned bills, were severally read the first, and by special orders, the second time, passed without amendment, and sent to the Senate for concurrence.

Mr. Sutton from the select committee appointed on leave granted for the purpose, reported a bill, entitled an act, to authorise the granting of writs of replevin by justices of the peace, and for other purposes therein mentioned; which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Burchenal from the select committee to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled an act, compelling the President and Directors for Dover bridge Company, to alter the draw of said bridge across Choptank river; which was read the first time; When,
