Maryland U. Extension Courses For 2nd Semester On Upper Shore

During the second semester The University of Maryland will offer four extension courses in upper Eastern Shore areas. The courses are open to anyone with two or more years of college work.

Registration for the courses will be conducted at the Centerville High School at 7:00 P. M. February 4.

Language Arts in the Elementary School (ECE ED 121B) will be given at Easton High School on Thursday nights. This course includes the teaching of spelling, handwriting, and oral and written expression. The first class meets February 11.

Introduction to Folklore (Eng 157) will be offered at Centerville High School on Tuesday nights. The course will cover the historical background of folklore, types of folklore with particular emphasis on American folklore. The first class meets February 9.

History of Maryland (Hist 142) will be given at Chestertown Elementary School on Thursday nights. The prerequisite of this course is History 5, 6 or the equivalent. It is a continuation of History 141. The course will consider Maryland's historical development and role as a state. The first class meets February 11.

Philosophy: Men Live By (Phil 123) will be offered at Denton High School on Tuesday nights. This course will explore the fundamental beliefs which determine what men make of their lives and of the world they live in. Classic

statements of these beliefs by great philosophers will be chosen for class discussion on the basis of their significance for the problems confronting modern men. The first class meets February 9.

An extension course is also offered at the Tolchester Nike Base. **Elementary German (Ger 1)** meets on Mondays and Thursdays from 6 to 9 p. m. The first class meets on February 8, the last class March 5. Registration for this course was on January 5. For further information contact CWO Thomas Ray Base, telephone 301-778-1830.

Elementary German (Ger 11) Prerequisite: German I. Registration at Tolchester Nike Base March 4 from 10:00 a. m. to 12:00 noon. Classes begin March 8 and end April 30.

The University catalogue states that all students are expected to complete registration in person on the day appointed for the center. This includes the filing of registration forms and the payment of bills. All previously admitted students must present admission cards at the time of registration. Students who have changed from other colleges of the University to University College will be required to show transfer of college card.

Undergraduate students matriculated in other colleges in the University must present letters from their Dean, granting permission to enroll in University College courses. This does not apply to teachers seeking courses for certification.

Graduate students admitted to the Graduate School must present matriculation cards at the time of registration.

Boyer Has Specific Measures In Mind

Delegate Elroy H. Boyer, prior to departure for Annapolis this morning, revealed that he had, at this time, two pieces of legislation in mind. He plans to consult the other two members of the Kent delegation before taking any action.

He expects to propose a resolution calling on the United States Congress to amend the Constitution to provide that representation in one house of state legislatures be based on something other than populations.

His other proposal, of a more local nature, would be a bill establishing regional Vocational Schools. His idea is, for example, a central school for Kent and Queen Anne's, with possibly inclusion of Caroline, to teach vocational and technical subjects.






